The Moreton In Marsh war memorial, which also covers those killed from the small neighbouring village of Batford, is located in the High Street.

The memorial consists of an octagonal flight of five steps, upon which stands an octagonal base containing 8 panels around the top of which is the following inscription with a red coloured background.

"IN GRATEFUL MEMORY OF THE MEN OF MORETON AND BATSFORD WHO
GAVE THEIR LIVES IN THE GREAT WAR"

Above this, in colour, are the arms of the county of Gloucestershire and St. George.

It is topped by a stone column at the top of which is the figure of St. George slaying the Dragon.

The front panel just contains the date 1914-1918, with a red coloured background matching the inscription above.

Four panels contain the names from the Great War

A much newer ground level slab in front in front of the memorial says

"In memory of those who gave their lives in The two World Wars 1914-1918 1939-1945 We remember them"

St. Davids church contains a war memorial alter and redros of oak that was placed in the Lady Chapel in 1927. It lists the above names from the Great War and an addition with the WWII names. On the wall to the side of this alter is a further oak panel –
